It was great to see such amazing teamwork in each one of the schools. At this point, I am unable to share the outcomes of all the inspections as three of these have still not been made public; however, I can say a huge congratulations and well done to everybody at Bromet and Oxhey Wood for the incredible outcomes achieved – both schools maintained their 'good' grading. Fantastic news and very well-deserved!

Although the inspections have kept us busy, there has also been a huge amount of recruitment work taking place over the past weeks. This is the result of the resignation of our Company Secretary, Jackie Goodhall, who is retiring at Easter. Jackie has dedicated much of her career to helping schools in Hertfordshire. She worked for Herts for Learning/HCC for 20 years before becoming a member of the Partnership's Executive Team; she has been part of the Trust since its inception in 2016. Jackie has been a fundamental member of the Partnership's development. Since the Trust began, Jackie has worked tirelessly to ensure Trustees, the central team and school leaders have received the support they need. She is most definitely the person we all turn to when we have a question or a query about the Trust and somebody we all rely on because her advice, guidance and support are second to none. Jackie is a hardworking, committed and passionate person who always does what it best for the children within the Trust; she is going to be greatly missed by everybody who works closely with her. It was an opportunity for children to get involved with some tree planting and learn about the numerous benefits, linking to themes such as climate change. Primary School had a really exciting half term; they enjoyed a wide range of events and activities. For example, the children in Year 4 enjoyed a Viking Day to support their 'humanities' learning, whilst Year 2 loved a pirate-themed day. Additionally, as part of the Trust offer to children through the Children's Pledge, Year 6 visited St. Mary's University and came back to school enthused with thoughts of what they would like to study. Amazing!

It has been a busy and active half term for everyone at Wilbury. Across the school, children have enjoyed an English unit based on the book The Spider and the Fly. The children have also been working to increase their emotional vocabulary. Each week, the 'word of the week' has been chosen from the school's emotional vocabulary wheel and groups of children have been making short videos to explain the word; these have been shared with the whole school. Additionally, the children have had the opportunity to engage in a range of in-school competitions, such as a portrait competition and a positive thinking poem and poster competition. Recently, the staff and children also had an opportunity to take part in the rope challenge!

At Oxhey Wood Primary School:

- The Year 6 children visited the Lincolnsfield Centre in Bushey as part of their World War 11 project; the children were able to apply their learning to realistic scenarios at the Centre;

On Friday 21st January 2022, Alban Wood Primary School and Nursery's local PCSO presented a special award to a member of Year 6; the winner of the award had designed a logo for a Mini Police project. Huge congratulations!

The children at Meryfield Community Primary enjoyed Safer Internet Day again this year. The theme was 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'. All classes from the Early Years to Year 6 looked at different aspects of online safety with a focus on gaming and our online behaviour and identity. Children explored this area through a variety of activities, including role play, games and discussions. This was very rewarding in many ways, as well as being fun!

A particular highlight included our 'Together at Waterside' learning initiative. For two days, we gave all classes permission to move slightly away from their usual curriculum and teach the children about someor 'relevant who was/is of good moral standing' and then compare that person's act(s) of 'moral goodness' to our Golden Rules. We had some great people studied by our classes, including Greta Thunberg, David Attenborough, Sir Captain Tom Moore and England football player Marcus Rashford who proved to be the most popular choice. All classes then fed back to the rest of the school, linking these acts of moral goodness to our Golden Rules.



The highlight for children and staff at The Grange Academy this half term was their annual writing competition. The competition included fifteen schools, all studying The Barnabus Project; a heartfelt, timely story celebrating diversity, bravery and solidarity. It certainly motivated the children. As part of the project, every class teacher nominated an endeavour and progress award; the endeavour award was for those children who showed great enthusiasm and 'gave their all' to the project and the progress award was given to children who made the most progress with a particular aspect of their writing. Additionally, the class teacher picked two pieces of writing for the 'Best Writer Competition.' Ms Hopwood had the pleasure of picking the writing that she most enjoyed reading; a tough task as the standard of writing was so high. Lucky winners received trophies, medals and certificates. The children also await the big reveal of the inter-school competition winners to be held later this month!
