There were over 250 schools, from all over the world, taking part in the heats...battling for a place in the final. The challenge has 4 rounds, all scored out of 60 and with a maximum score of 240; although one round focuses on estimation making it almost impossible to score full marks!

The children at The Orchard Primary School excelled themselves during the heat. The average score this year was 138 but the children at The Orchard scored an impressive 218...not only securing a place in the final but coming 1st in the heats overall. A huge well done and congratulations!

Agora Associates

In September 2021, the Agora Learning Partnership launched the Together Strategy. The Strategy details how everybody across the Partnership will work together over a three-year period to secure Trust-wide improvement. The core purpose of the strategy is to enhance, and not replace, the individual work of schools and assist in improving the life chances of the children and young people within and across the Partnership...ultimately helping them to flourish and achieve the very best outcomes in all aspects of school life and beyond.

One aspect of the Together Strategy focusses on the development of staff and there is recognition within the 'Together for Staff' strand that, to retain the Partnership's talented staff, it is essential to recognise and celebrate their achievements whilst giving them opportunities to share their skills, knowledge and expertise.

In the summer term 2022, a Partnership-wide 'talent spotting' system was launched which resulted in 'Agora Associates' being appointed from a number of schools within the Partnership; since then, there have been regular recruitment rounds.

Currently, thirteen talented members of staff have been appointed as Agora Associates and they deliver high quality school-toschool support and assist with the delivery of the Together Strategy. However, there is a determination to appoint more Agora Associates in order to build capacity within the group and broaden the range of skills, knowledge and expertise. As such, the Trust is seeking to appoint more individuals to the Agora Associate role.

Details of the Trust's recruitment process are detailed below.

What is an Agora Associate?

An Agora Associate is a member of staff, from any one of the staff groups within the Partnership, who has been recognised as being talented in one or more aspects of their work as the result of a formal application process.

The talents of an Agora Associate can be very specific (for example, a member of a school's administrative team who is exceptional in their use of Arbor, a teaching assistant who is remarkable in the support they offer children with a specific need or a teacher who is highly effective in the teaching of a specific curriculum area, such as phonics) or very broad (which would include those staff who are exceptional in all aspects of their role and responsibilities).

With the support and agreement from their Headteacher, an Agora Associate will give some of their time within their working hours to support colleagues in need of help, support or training linked to the Agora Associate's area of talent. The support will take a variety of forms; examples include a visit or visits to another school to support a member of staff (or group of staff), leading a Partnership-wide collaborative working group or delivering a training session on behalf of the Trust.

Staff will not receive payment for this work but will, instead, benefit from this remarkable opportunity for professional development.

Becoming an Agora Associate enables staff to offer support across the Partnership for a limited amount of time, whilst continuing to carry out their roles and responsibilities in school.

How are Agora Associates deployed?

Once appointed, the name and specific talents of each Agora Associate will be added to a matrix developed centrally. The Agora Associates will then be deployed to support other schools and colleagues when the need arises.

All deployments are agreed with the Agora Associate and their Headteacher/Executive Headteacher, ensuring there is sufficient capacity.

Thereafter, the Agora Associate will be deployed (within their working hours) for a set period of time; generally, no more than three days in total in any one academic year.

On completion of the work, the Agora Associate and the relevant school leaders will complete evaluations to determine the impact of the support.

How will the Partnership help the Agora Associates prepare for their new role?

All Agora Associates will be invited to attend induction sessions to help them prepare for the Agora Associate role. This will be followed by further training sessions and meetings over time.

How can a member of staff become an Agora Associate?

All staff who are interested in becoming an Agora Associate will need to complete the application form attached and submit it to HR@agoralearning.co.uk by Friday 3rd May 2024.

All applications will need to be supported by the respective Headteacher/Executive Headteacher (or in the event of a Headteacher/Executive Headteacher wishing to apply, the Chair of the Academy Governing Board).

When will applicants find out if they have been successful?

All applicants will be informed by the end of the first half of the summer term 2024, if they have been successful, with dates for their induction in the second half of the summer term 2024.

Unsuccessful applicants will receive feedback that they can consider should they wish to apply again in the future.

Is this the only opportunity to become an Agora Associate?

There will be more opportunities for staff to apply to be an Agora Associate in the next academic year and beyond, in light of the fact that staff will develop their skills, knowledge, expertise and experience over time. This means, staff who are interested will have the opportunity to apply when the time is right for them.

When does the Agora Associate role start?

All the Agora Associates appointed in the summer term 2024 will commence their roles in the autumn term 2024. However, it is unlikely that all Agora Associates will be deployed in the first term. Agora Associates will only be deployed when there is call for their particular talents.




Warren Dell Primary School

Waterside Academy


