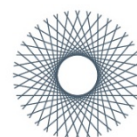

The Agora Learning Partnership requires all of its academies to comply with appropriate legislation, including health and safety, for all policies and procedures relating to the condition of the estate. This includes safe management and maintenance of aspects such as asbestos, fire safety and statutory testing.

The Agora Learning Partnership's Health and Safety Statement is the lead document for health and safety within the Trust and applies to all staff, governors, visitors and contractors. Each Academy Governing Board (AGB) is required to establish specific health and safety policy statements and organisational arrangements to implement the Trust's policy, in line with Hertfordshire County Council's model policy and guidance. This includes, among others, risk assessments, monitoring and inspection, fire safety and asbestos.

3. **Emergency planning and response**

How schools and other educational settings should plan for and deal with emergencies, including severe weather and floods
